Headlines

Crime

- Victim based crime continues to fall, with the volume in August 2019 being 9.2% lower than the equivalent month in 2018 (284 fewer offences).

ASB

- The rolling 12 month volume of police recorded ASB incidents increased slightly in August, however the overall trend is stable with little change over the past year.











Hate Crime

- In July the rolling 12 month volume of repeat victims of hate crime decreased for the third consecutive month. However the proportion of all victims that are repeats remains unchanged from the 2018/19 baseline.

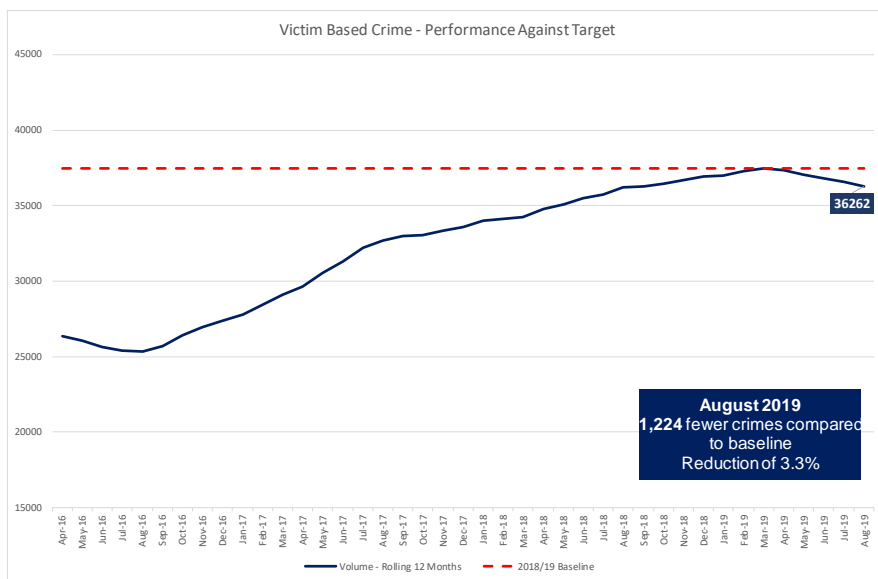
Substance Misuse

- Victim based crime has reduced by 1,224 (-3.3%) offences against the 2018/19 baseline.
- Improvements can be seen across a range of offence types that are priorities for the partnership. This is particularly noticeable in relation to acquisitive crime (residential burglary, personal robbery and vehicle theft) and knife crime.
- Violent crime remains the performance issue of primary concern, in particular violence without injury.
- Night Time Economy violence has increased by 4.4% against the baseline (70 offences). This has been driven by disproportionately high offence volumes in April and May 2019. Volumes across the summer returned to levels comparable to that seen in previous years. This is discussed in more detail below.
- Volumes of stalking and harassment remain high following the changes to the counting rules in April 2018. This is the primary reason for the current increase in domestic violence related crime.

Future Reporting

- Future reports will contain information from the PCC Police & Crime Survey. This will cover the experience and frequency of crime from a victim perspective. The data includes crimes reported to the police, as well as those that are not.
- Knife crime is addressed in a separate performance report.

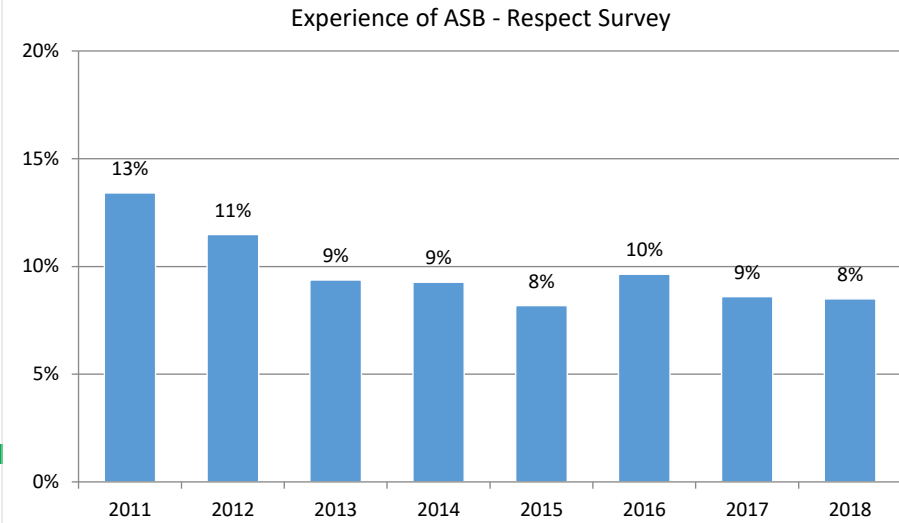
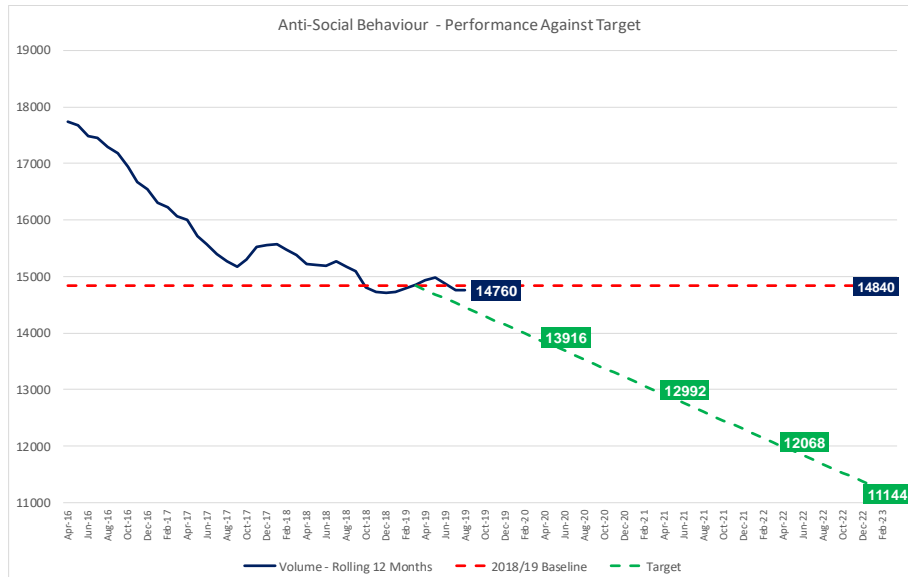
Changes to Counting Rules for Recorded Crime

- As of 1st July 2019 the counting rules for recorded crime have been amended in relation to harassment offences. The rule for the recording of breaches of harassment injunction, non-molestation, restraining orders and criminal behaviour orders has been amended so that all breaches should be recorded in addition to any other crimes disclosed. This is likely to increase the volume of stalking and harassment offences. More information can be found at [Counting Rules Update July 2019](#).

- Fieldwork for the 2019 Respect for Nottingham Survey will begin in October.
- The headline measure for the Council Plan and Crime & Drugs Partnership Plan will be police recorded incidents. This will be underpinned by a performance framework covering a broad range of data from a number of partner agencies.

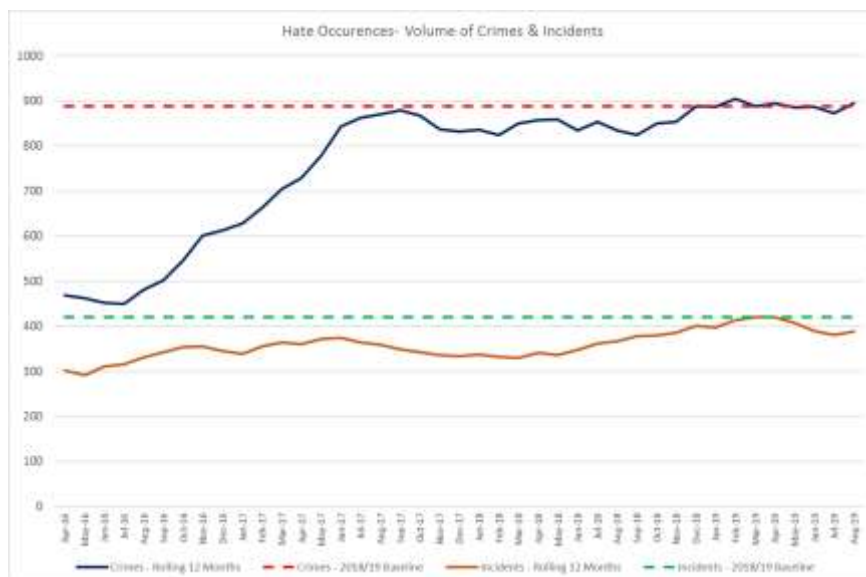
Future Reporting

- Volumes of hate incidents have been broadly stable since mid-2017 following a sharp increase after the 2016 EU referendum.
- Race related hate crime remains overwhelmingly the largest category, accounting for 66% of all hate occurrences over the past 12 months.
- Hate incidents in respect of sexual orientation have risen by 25.42% against the 2018/19 baseline. This equates to 30 occurrences and remains the performance issue of primary concern.
- A modest increase against the 2018/19 baseline can be seen in relation to transgender hate occurrences (+21.2%, 7 more incidents).
- Whilst the volume reduced further in August, the number of repeat victims has risen consistently since June 2016. Work is ongoing to better understand the reasons for this and the most appropriate strategic and tactical response. This forms part of the ongoing reviews of the Hate Crime & Cohesion Sub-Group and Nottingham Hate Incident Performance Panel.

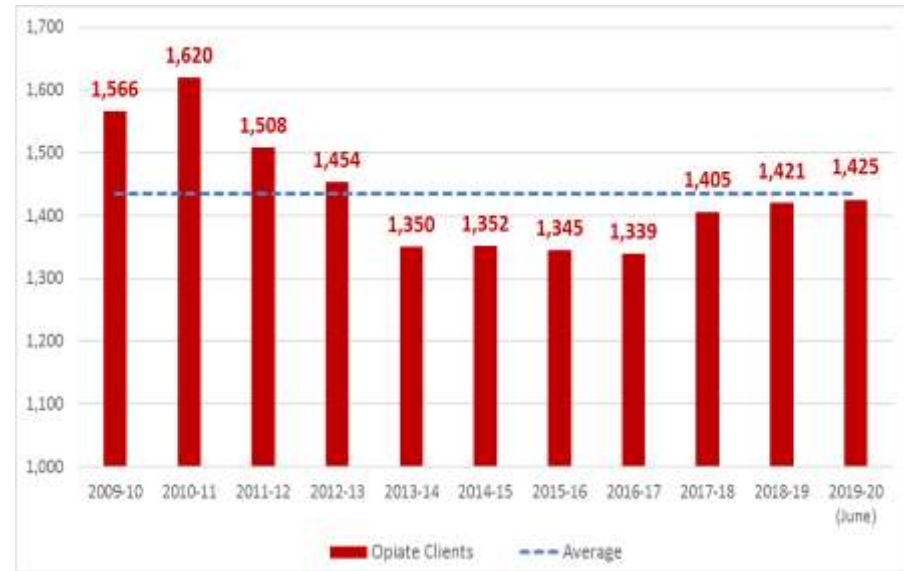
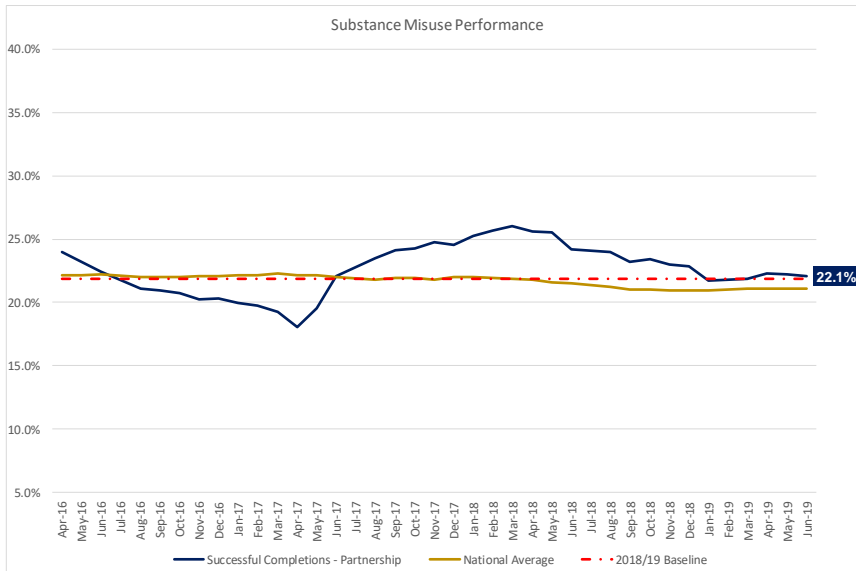
Future Reporting

- The ongoing review work noted above will result in greater level of detail being available in respect of repeat victimisation. This should allow a more sophisticated partnership response to be developed alongside a greater level of detail in performance reporting.

Drug treatment data is not available in July due to Public Health England undertaking annual system maintenance and data cleans

- Performance data for drug treatment services is published two months in arrears. Therefore, data for 2019/20 is only available up to June.
- Performance pressures at present primarily relate to increasing numbers of opiate users and the associated costs, alongside systemic problems in the criminal justice system – both internal and external. This are likely to remain for the foreseeable future.
- 44% of clients in community treatment are opiate and/or crack users. In criminal justice treatment the figure rise to 63%. The successful completion rate for the two services are 27.0% and 14.8% respectively. The rate for the criminal justice service has declined by 1.7 percentage points against the 2018/19 baseline.

Future Reporting

- Future reports will include a greater level of detail around the criminal justice service, in particular the number of clients receiving court mandated treatment requirements and those being tested on arrest for trigger offences.
- Representations and waiting times for services will also be monitored closely in order to identify any issues of concern.
